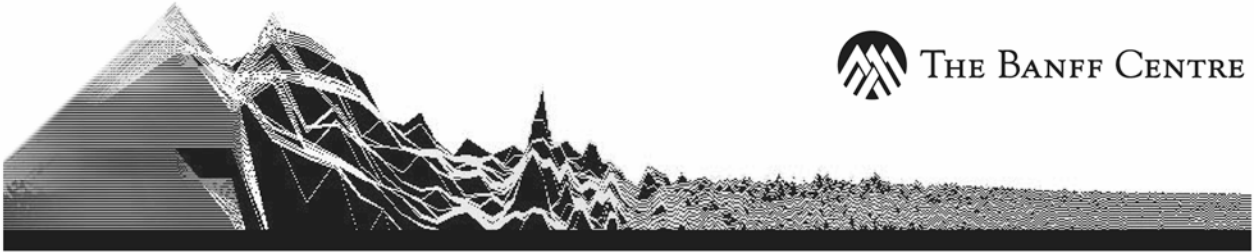

“Inside/Outside: Responsive Environments and Ubiquitous Presence” considers the responsive environments of everyday life and extends these into performance and display. These include fashion and wearable technologies, home technologies, artworks and architectures.

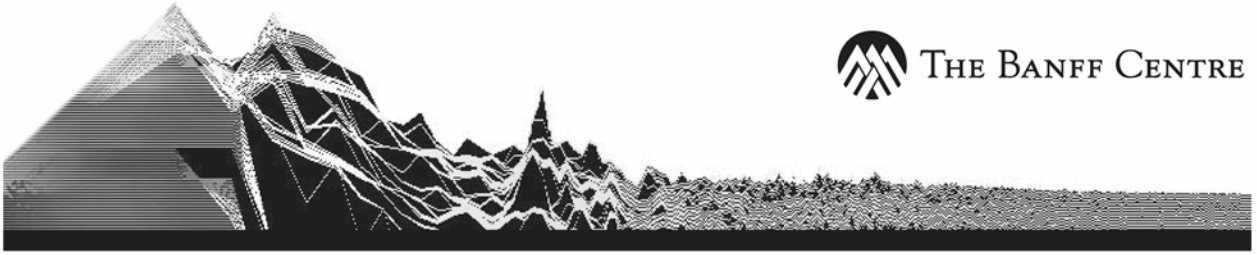
Fashion: The summit piggy backs onto and extends the dialogues from **“Outside/Inside: Boundary Crossings A Wearable Design Workshop”**, a four day deep exploration of wearable computing, fashion and costume. It will extend the metaphor and materials of response to consider wearable computing. Material, fabric, garment, costume, device and experience designers will share their work with engineers, scientists, fashion theorists, technology companies and each other.

The workshop and the summit will consider in what contexts do men and women make use of wearable computers? What are creative approaches for creating wearable content experiences and expressions, what are the challenges (power sources for example)? How do we analyze fashion that lives under and on the skin?

Architectures: Public Spaces and Private: What value does ubiquity provide to architecture? What is the nano dream home of the future? Can your home emulate the subtlety of your emotions? Can it heal you? Can environments be extensible, wearable, inhabitable, and mobile? What is the future of urban spaces? What are the tensions between surveillance and responsiveness? Is ubiquity frightening, desirable?

The Ecological and Human Environment: Are responsive environments alive? Are they ecologically friendly? How do we understand the changing nature of “nature”?

Immersive and Responsive Cultural Spaces: Musicians, designers and artists have created immersive and responsive experiences that transport their participants. What can we learn about the new powers of sound, tactile, olfactory, and visual media?

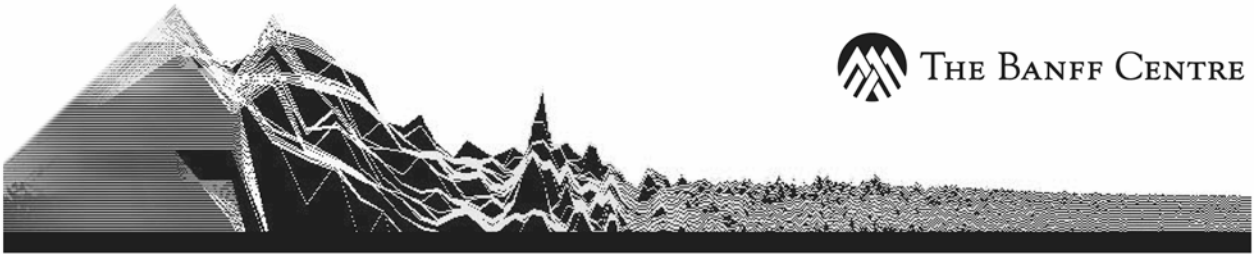
Engineering Responsiveness: What are the scientific and engineering strategies that combine to create responsive spaces, garments and ecologies?
