B1/C1 - Math-terpiece Theatre

Grade: 7

Subject/Art Form: Math/Geometry through Drama

B3/C3 - Online Community

Level: Intermediate to Secondary

Use storytelling, movement and tableau to predict mannerly endings to Jane Yolen's popular book. See how drama translates to the written word by creating text for your own illustrated conclusions!

D2 - Soundscape Novel Study

Levels: Intermediate to Secondary

Create a soundscape using the software Garage Band and learn to explore the elements of fiction through sound.

D3 - Locative Media

Grades: 5 - 12

Subject/Art Form: General Technology

An introductory exploration into locative media (such as Global Positioning Systems - GPS) and some of its boundless potential uses. *Priority for this workshop will be given to Banff area teachers.*
