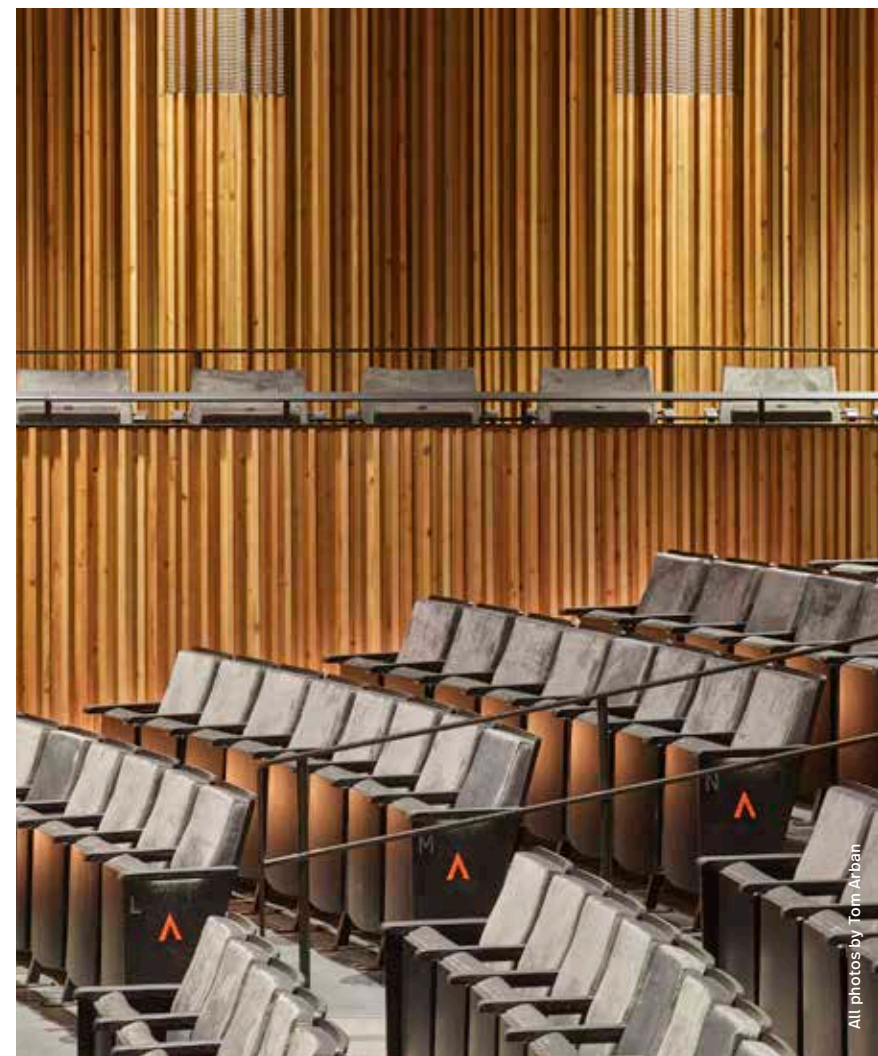
Theatre Complex

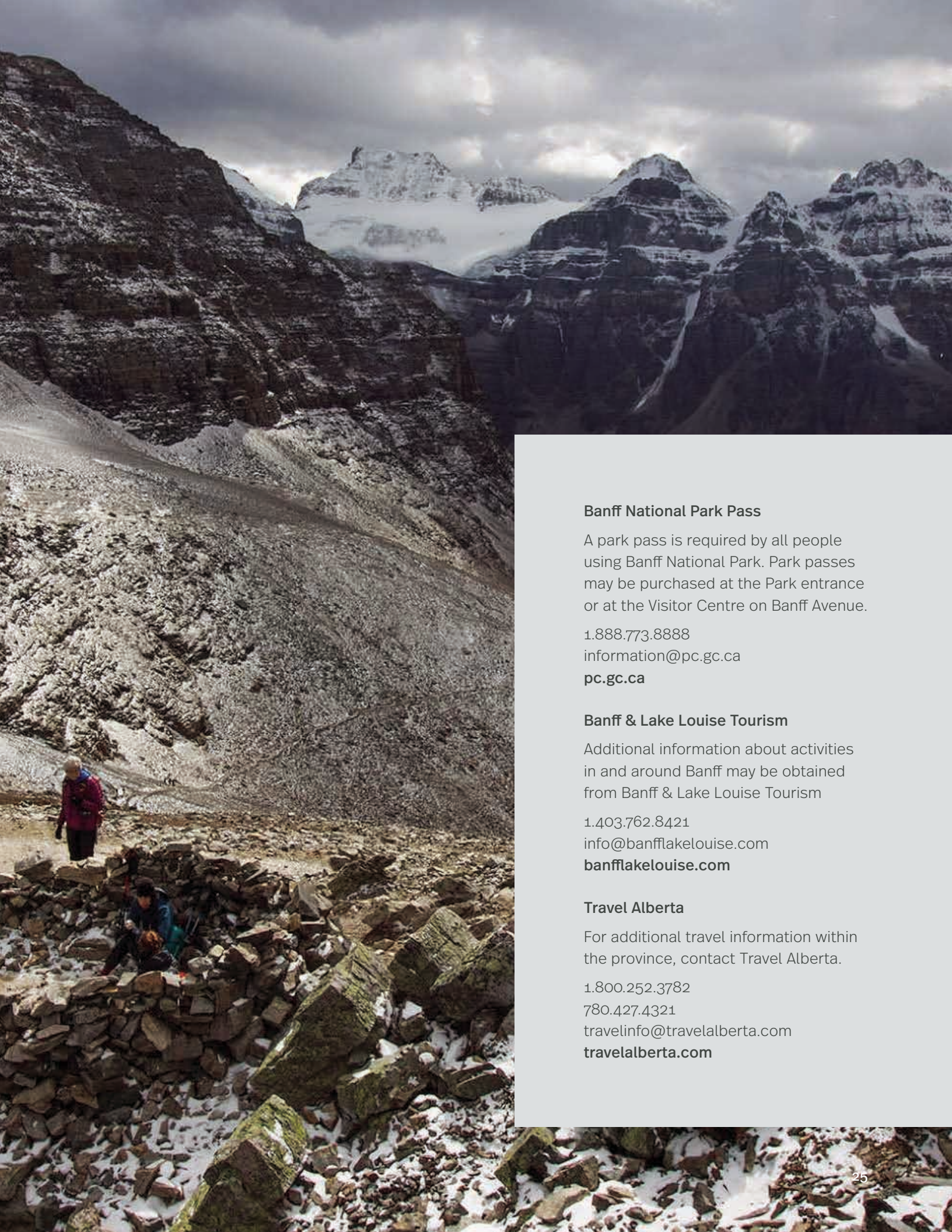

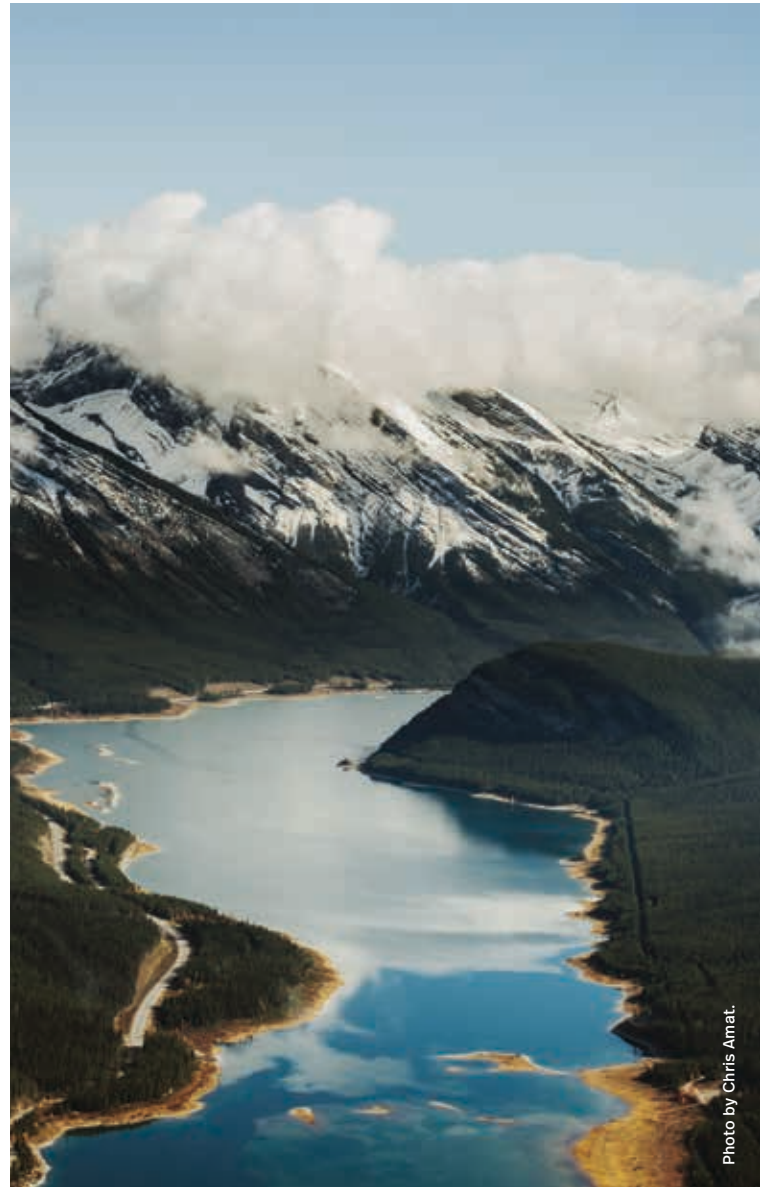

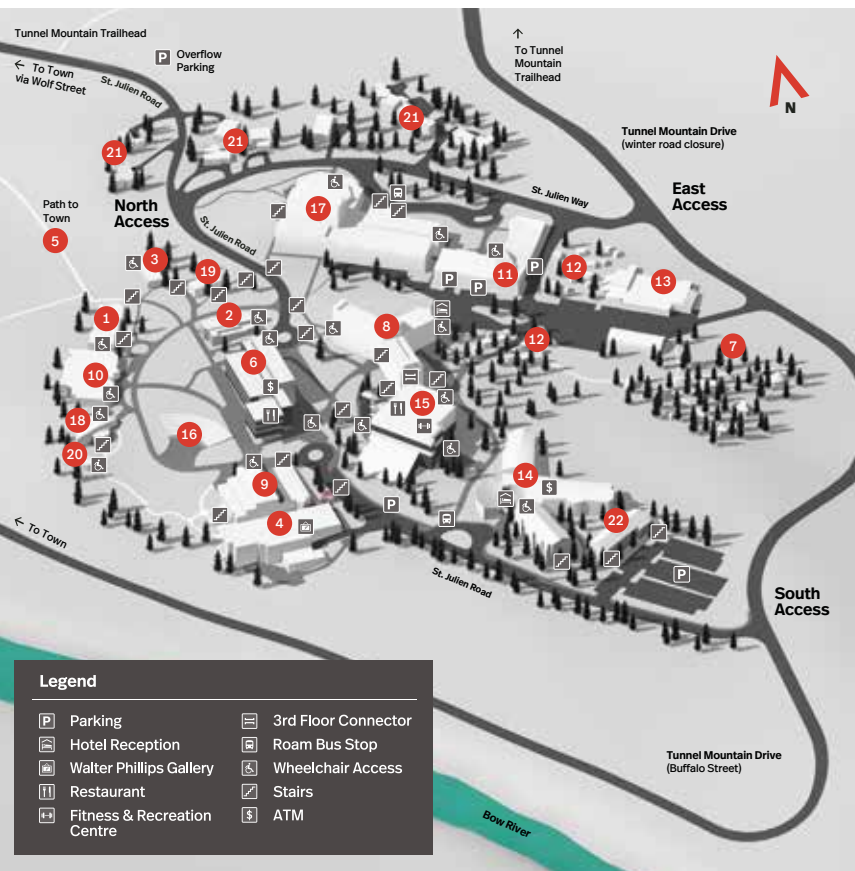
