Guests wound their way through open studios, enjoyed live music on the ceramics deck, wore floral sculptures, and toured Walter Phillips Gallery's exhibition by Israeli artist **Yael Bartana**, guest-curated by Sao Paolo's **Ana Paula Cohen**.

At the Friday night culinary festival guests then mingled with friends and artists, enjoying fine wine and cuisine before the Friday Night LIVE's performance showcase. Hosted by renowned playwright and Banff Centre alumnus **Daniel MacIvor**, and Banff Centre's Vice President Arts **Carolyn Warren**, the showcase featured a diverse line-up of performances from top Banff Centre artists in many disciplines.

Mentored in Banff by the legendary **Buffy Sainte-Marie**, Cree vocalist and rising star **Mariame Hasni** launched the festivities with her powerful voice and stage presence. Award-winning dancer **Peter Chu** performed Banff Centre alumna Crystal Pite's solo piece, *A Picture of You Falling*. DJ, music producer, and award-winning graphic novelist **Kid Koala** brought his own electricity to the evening by collaborating with the **Cecilia String Quartet**, 2010 Banff International String Quartet Competition winners.

The Friday night party continued in our Maclab Bistro lounge and patio with live music, cocktails, and great company.

After enjoying the optional guided Saturday morning walk and vivid mountaintop scenery, our chefs treated guests to the Musical Mountaintop Breakfast. Saturday's three Creative Spotlights and Guided Arts Tour offered unique glimpses into Banff Centre's multi-disciplinary programming.

Hosted by Program Director Brian Calliou, the Indigenous Leadership & Management Spotlight talk explored idea generation through an Indigenous lens of knowing and highlighted concepts of community, reciprocity and respect. In the Dance Spotlight, Artistic Director of Dance Emily Molnar offered a sneak peek of Banff Centre's contemporary dance program. This rare opportunity enabled guests to see a new work in progress and to experience the creative process with an international team of collaborators. including **Stephan Laks, Fernando** Melo, and Ellen Lauren.

In the **Literary Arts Spotligh**t, Director of Literary Arts **Devyani Saltzman** highlighted details of Banff Centre literary arts programming and Literary Journalism Chair, RBC Taylor Prizewinning author and *Globe and Mail* columnist **Ian Brown** treated guests to a side-splitting reading from his

acclaimed book *Sixty*. In the afternoon Arts Tour, guests witnessed the unveiling of our new concert grand piano, toured and met artists in our theatre costume workshop, and experimented with interactive media and production technology in our media and audio studios.

Saturday's **Gala Ball** celebrated the richness that art brings to the world. The gala featured world-class performances by Banff Centre faculty including internationally acclaimed Canadian soprano **Adrianne Pieczonka**, and JUNO Award nominee and international trumpet virtuoso, **Jens Lindemann** paying tribute to the late Ken Taylor. After savouring a four-course feast, guests hit the dance floor to the sounds of the **Barry Shaw Band**, and enjoyed the late-night scotch lounge into the wee hours.

On Sunday, Banff Centre President & CEO Janice Price and Ian Findlay hosted their annual brunch. Guests then made their way to the Shaw Amphitheatre for afternoon performances by exceptional Banff Centre alumni: **Basia Bulat**, an indie singer-songwriter sensation known for her soaring voice and soulful lyrics, and **Ron Sexsmith**, the JUNO award-winning Canadian icon—the perfect conclusion to a superb 37th Midsummer Ball Weekend.
