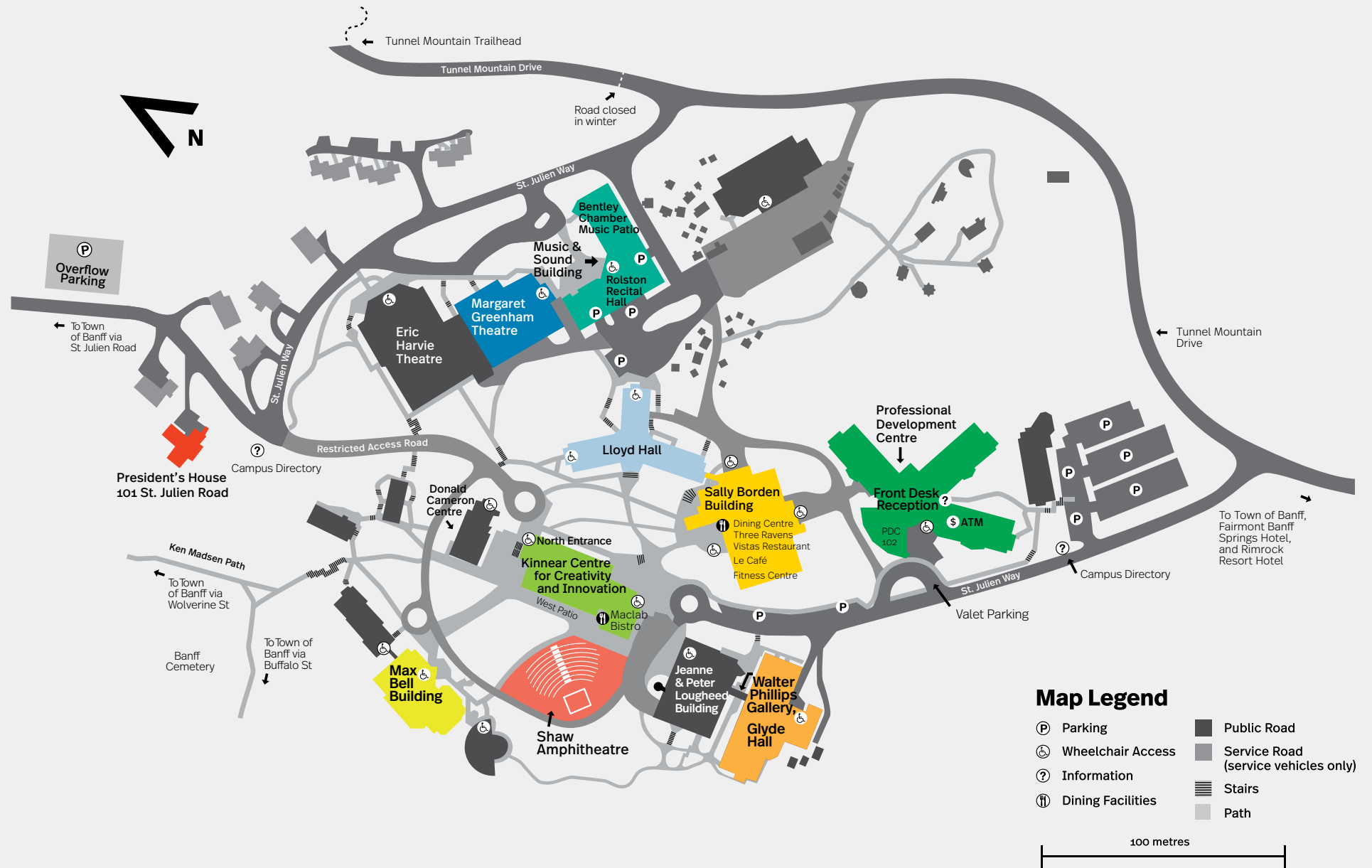

Rick Miller is a Dora and Gemini award-winning writer/performer/director and a Banff Centre alumnus. Well-known as host of *Just for Laughs* for three years, he has performed in five languages on five continents. She presents and collaborates in multiple genres, such as performance poetry, experimental documentary film, sound art, video poetry, spoken word, and recorded poetry with music. Janet is also a print poet, with five published titles to date, and she works as a freelance producer of radio content, film and podcasts.

A Banff Centre alumnus and faculty member, Jens Lindemann is hailed as one of the most celebrated soloists in his instrument's history. This contemporary residency creates a rare space in the dance world for today's curious professional dance artist to explore the current state of dance through process, creation and performance. Creative Gesture dancers benefit from collaborating with participants from Designing for Dance, an Andrea Brussa Master Artists Program, who are working to perfect the craft of costume fabrication. 2017 Creative Gesture participants will perform an excerpt from *Noetic* by internationally acclaimed choreographer Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui. *Noetic* will be performed in its entirety July 27-29 in the Eric Harvie Theatre.

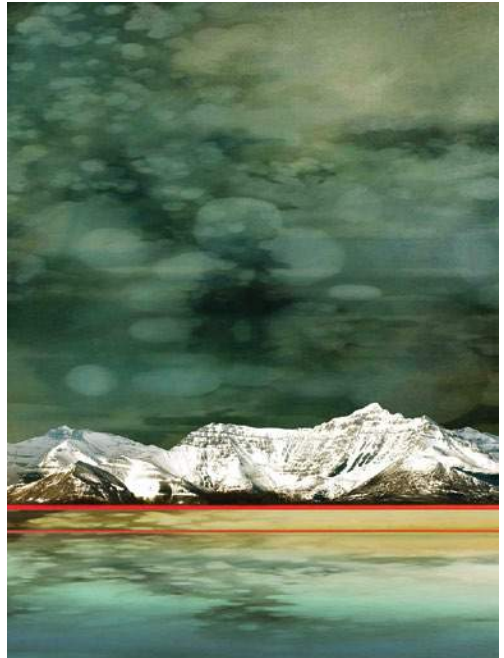

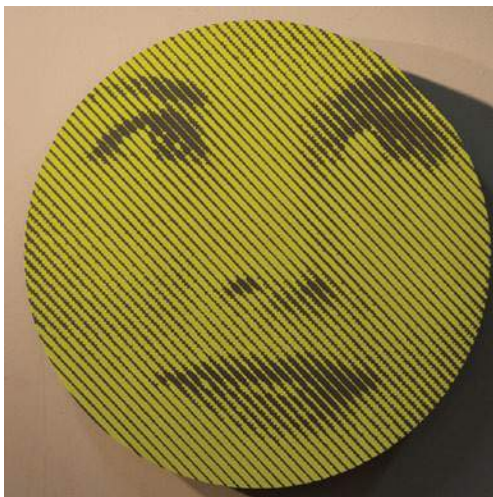

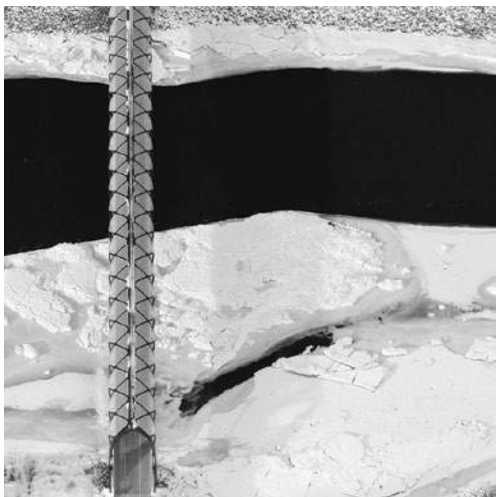
