Born in St. John's, Newfoundland, Mary Walsh is a remarkably versatile comedic and dramatic actor, as well as a writer and director. Her many accomplishments include the creation of CBC's *This Hour Has 22 Minutes*, and Gemini Award-winning *Hatching, Matching and Dispatching*. She is a Member of the Order of Canada and a recipient of a Governor General's Performing Arts Award for Lifetime Artistic Achievement. Mary was a Banff Centre Fleck Fellow in 2016, wrote her first novel during a Leighton Artist Studio residency, and most recently created *Canada, It's Complicated* in Banff, which went on national tour in 2017.

Stoney Welcome - Daryl Kootenay

A traditional singer, dancer, artist and youth leader from the Stoney Nakoda Nation of Treaty 7 in southern Alberta, Daryl Dancing Buffalo Kootenay works with Bow Valley youth, teaching and performing traditional art and dance. He is a recipient of the Governor General's Sovereign's Medal for Volunteers.

Séan McCann

Guitarist and songwriter Séan McCann first performed in Banff as a member of the internationally renowned folk group Great Big Sea. Since parting company with the band in 2013, Séan has returned to Banff Centre many times to write music, to perform, and to mentor others as a faculty member. Music is Séan's medicine, and the mountains are a place of reflection and inspiration. In addition to touring, Séan has recorded five solo albums, is writing a memoir, and performs at speaking engagements about overcoming addiction.

Opera in the 21st Century

Witness the transformation of opera with this performance from Banff Centre's Opera Program participants. Under the direction of Joel Ivany, and musical direction of Christopher Mokrzewski, Opera in the 21st Century is a performance-based, collaborative training experience for emerging opera professionals that transcends the conventions of opera performance, production, and design.

Quantum Tangle

Quantum Tangle combines the wide-ranging artistic vision of Greyson Gritt and Tiffany Ayalik. Drawing from their respective Anishinaabe-Métis and Inuit backgrounds, Greyson and Tiffany create a fusion of old-world sounds and new-world flair by combining deep blues riffs, traditional throat singing, and haunting melodies, intertwined with hard beats and equally hard-hitting storytelling. JUNO award winning Quantum Tangle were most recently at Banff Centre to compose and direct the music for the Mary Walsh production of *Canada, It's Complicated*. Quantum Tangle welcomes newest band member Kayley Mackay on percussion and vocals.

AFTER-PARTY JAZZ Hutchinson Andrew Trio

Bassist Kodi Hutchinson, and drummer Karl Schwonik - both alumni of Banff Centre - and pianist Jon Day have been a prominent force on the Canadian and North American jazz scene since 2005. The trio has earned numerous award nominations and won the prestigious TD Grand Jazz Award at the Montreal International Jazz Festival in 2013.
