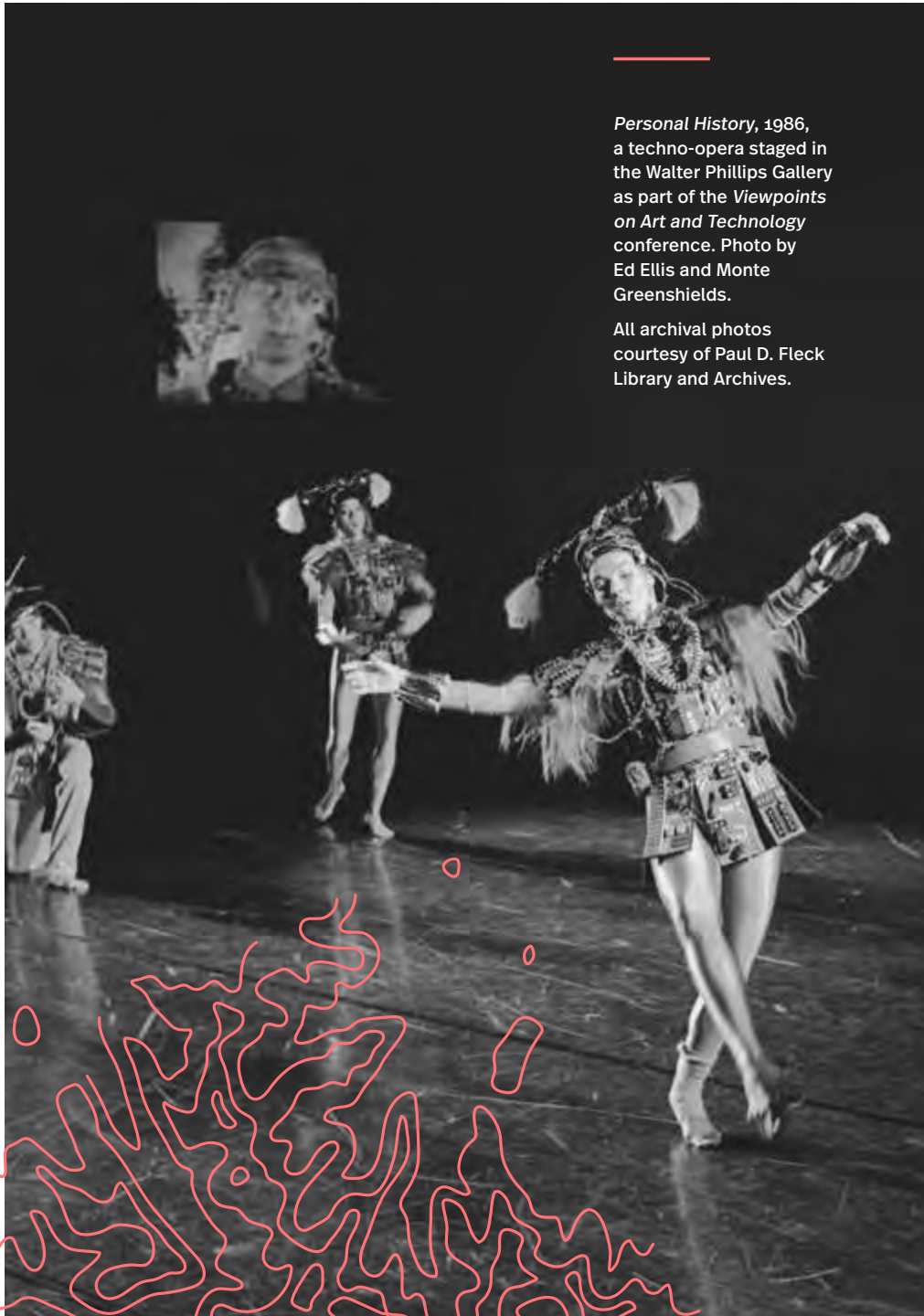

Here's to another great Midsummer Ball Weekend!

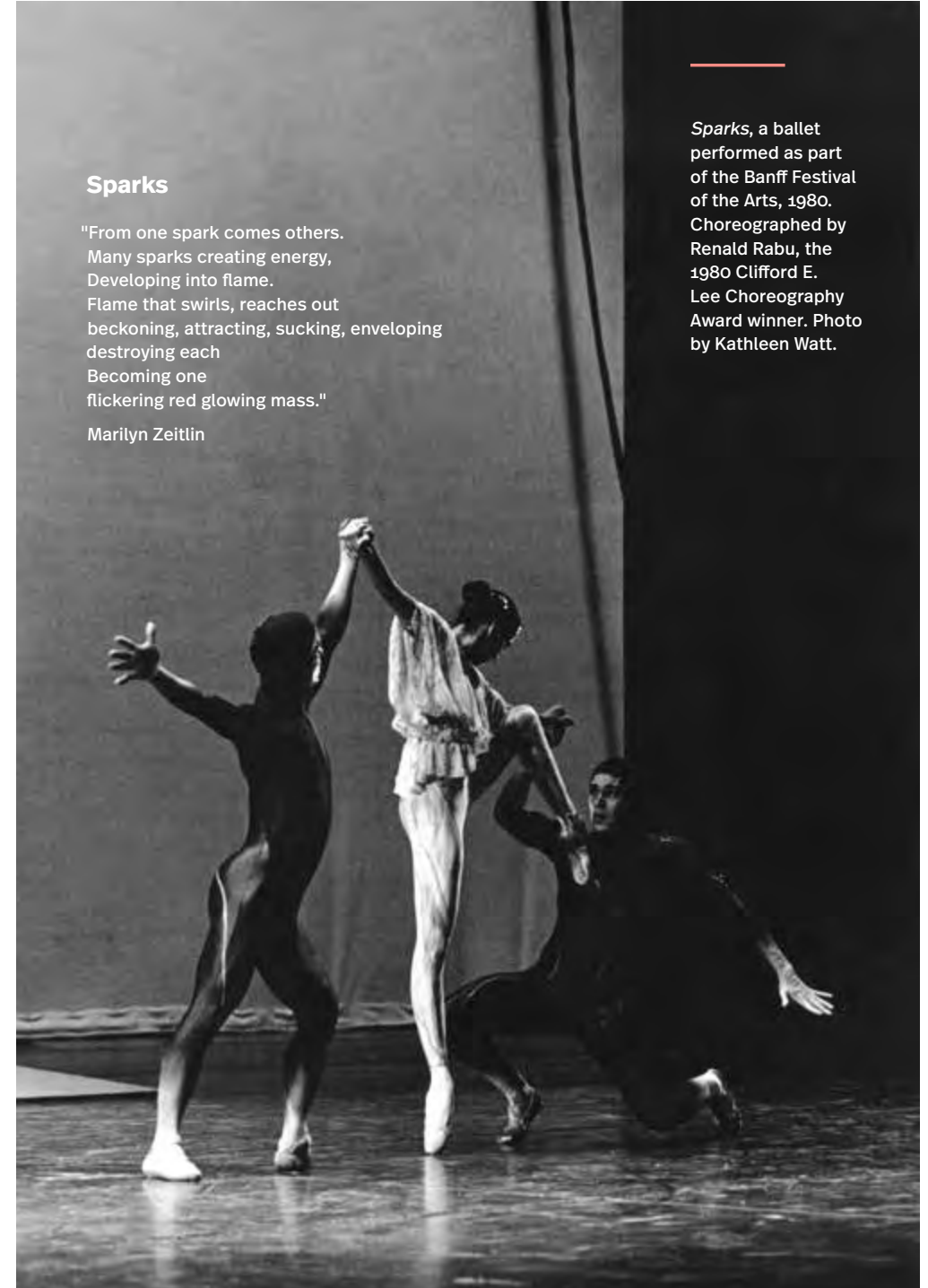

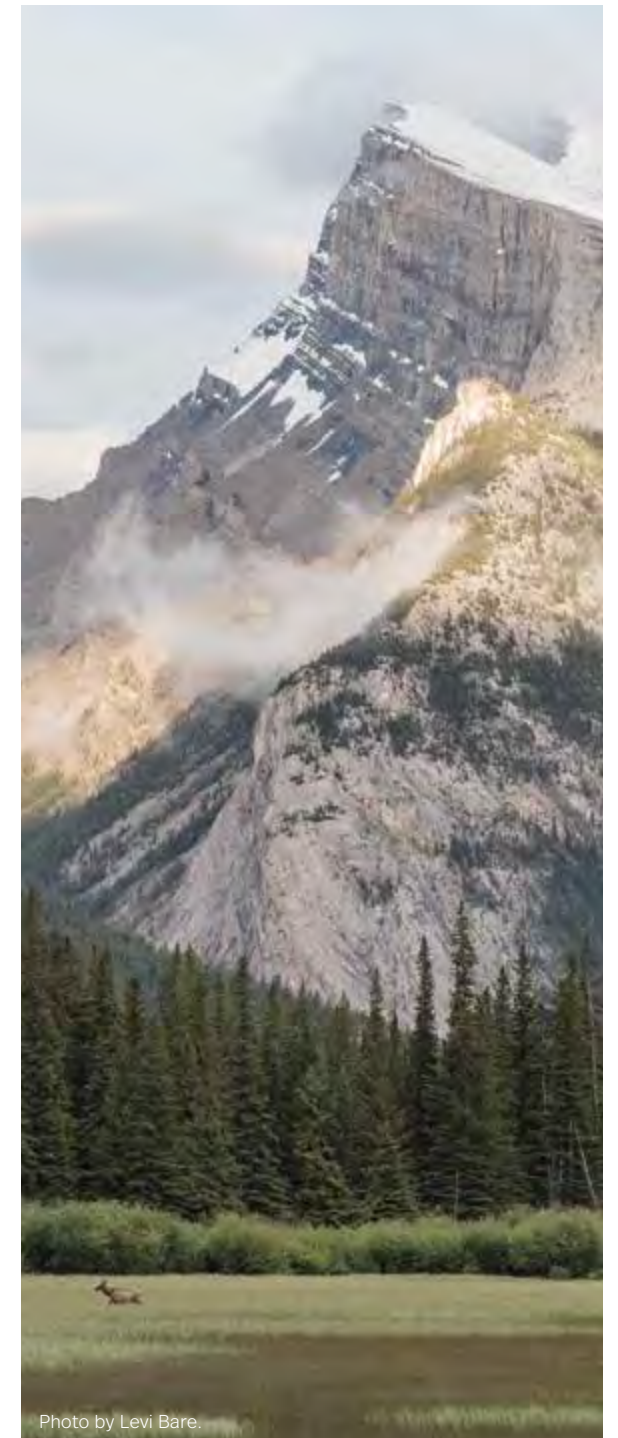

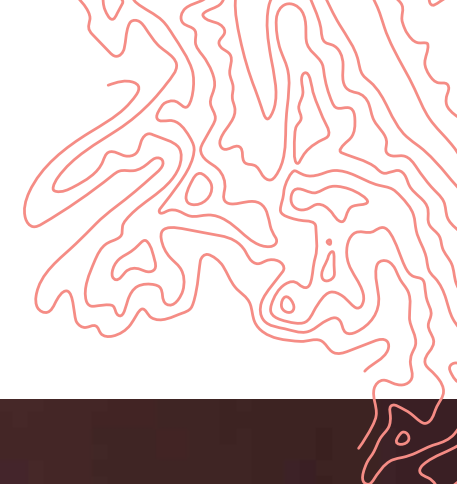

Sarah Murphy-Dyson

Hailing from Victoria, B.C., Gemini Award winner Sarah Murphy-Dyson attended Banff Centre’s *Professional Dance Program* for seven summers between 1991 and 2003. Sarah was a First Soloist with the Royal Winnipeg Ballet for nine seasons, and also danced with Alberta Ballet, Pro Arte Danza, and she played “Penny” in the North American premiere of *Dirty Dancing* (Mirvish). She coached Jennifer Lopez for *Shall We Dance* (Miramax), and was a stunt double for Kate Beckinsale and Milla Jovovich.

Sarah now works mostly as an actor in Toronto and can be seen on such shows as *Suits* (NBC) and *Off Kilter* (CBC), but still choreographs, coaches, and occasionally dances.

Sarah will be performing a scene from her award-winning one-woman play, *The Naked Ballerina*.

Aisslinn Nosky

Aisslinn Nosky first visited Banff Centre in 1992 for a Music program. Since then she has attended 11 music residencies and is currently the program director of EQ: *Evolution of the String Quartet* program. She has a reputation for being one of the most dynamic and versatile violinists of her generation, and is in high demand internationally as a soloist, director, and conductor. She is a member of the Eybler Quartet and a former member of Tafelmusik Baroque Orchestra. Aisslinn is accompanied by participants in the EQ program.

Santee Smith

From the Kahnyen'kehàka Nation, Turtle Clan from Six Nations of the Grand River, Santee Tekaronhiákhwa Smith is a multi-disciplinary artist, award-winning producer, and choreographer. Her artistic work speaks about identity, and embodies Indigenous practice generated from body, story, and place. She has since participated in 12 creation residencies across multiple disciplines between 1997-2019. Founder of Kaha:wi Dance Theatre, Santee has collaborated on works for Canada's National Ballet School, National Arts Centre Orchestra, and the Canadian Opera Company. Santee is the Chancellor Designate for McMaster University.

Irena Welhasch Baerg

Irena Welhasch Baerg is a major lyric soprano opera singer who made her debut in 1983 as Liù in the Canadian Opera Company's production of *Turandot*. She has sung with most Canadian opera companies and has also appeared in Toronto's original *Phantom of the Opera* by Andrew Lloyd Webber. Irena attended Banff Centre in 1980 in the Academy of Singing & Opera Programs, and in 1981 in the Opera program.

Gala Showcase Performances

Emceed by Jens Lindemann, C.M.

Banff Centre alumnus and faculty Jens Lindemann is the first classical brass player to ever receive the Order of Canada, and is the foremost trumpet soloist in our country's history. An internationally-recognized virtuoso and multiple JUNO and Grammy award nominee, Jens has performed in every major concert hall in the world and has an extensive discography in a multitude of styles. Jens is the only trumpeter to win the "Grand Prize" in the 60-year history of the Canadian Music Competition.



Shauna Rolston

Shauna Rolston

Award-winning Edmonton-born cellist Shauna Rolston is considered by peers, the press, and fans alike to be one of the most compelling and distinctive musical voices on the stage today. She has performed in many of the world's major concert halls including Wigmore Hall, Concertgebouw, Lincoln Center, and Carnegie Hall, and was the featured artist at the 1988 Winter Olympic Games. Shauna continues to delight and astonish with a busy schedule of concerts, recordings, and world premieres, and as a Professor of Cello at the University of Toronto. Being a regular Visiting Artist to Music programs at Banff Centre only scratches the surface of her long history with the Centre. Shauna will be accompanied by a cello quartet of Banff Centre alumni in this final Showcase performance of the 40th Midsummer Ball.

Arnold Choi

Arnold Choi is a first prize laureate of numerous national and international cello competitions and has recorded extensively. He serves as the principal cellist of the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra and is faculty at Mount Royal University, and has taken Banff Centre music programs from 1994-2013.

Meran Currie-Roberts

Meran Currie-Roberts is a multi-talented artist who enjoys a successful career as a cellist, teacher, and administrator across Canada. She studied at the University of Toronto with Shauna Rolston, performs with the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra, is on faculty at the University of Alberta, and is Banff Centre alum from 1996 and 1997.
