AN ADAPTIVE AND RESILIENT ORGANIZATION

While we do not know what the continued impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic will be in the coming months, we do know that Banff Centre is committed to keeping connected with artists and leaders, wherever they may find themselves in the world. Throughout these uncertain times, Banff Centre will continue to provide artists and leaders with resources and program offerings, all the while looking to future opportunities such as artist residencies and on-campus programming. We know that artists and leaders will be looking to Banff Centre, whether for inspiration or professional development through online programs and initiatives, and eventually – when safe to do so in person – as a gathering place. We anticipate becoming an even more important resource for performing artists, visual artists, writers, film and new media practitioners, Indigenous artists and leaders.

BANFF CENTRE MOVING FORWARD

Since 1933, Banff Centre has offered courses, creation residencies, and performance opportunities for artists to hone and develop their craft. More than 80,000 artists and leaders from nearly 100 countries have taken part in Banff Centre courses and residencies over 87 years.

In 1954, Banff Centre developed a vibrant hospitality business that has, in recent years, generated close to 40% of the organization's revenue. This revenue flows back into the organization to support arts and leadership programs in a social enterprise model. Since 1971, Banff Centre has offered Indigenous management and leadership programming and since the early 1990s, Indigenous Arts.

Banff Centre will thoughtfully and deliberately open its campus facilities and spaces when it is safe and financially feasible to do so. We look forward to moving ahead with oncampus, world-class programming across all disciplines when our facilities can open. In the meantime, the show will go on – digitally.

We know that Banff Centre cannot, and will not, separate from the power of place – our campus, long a gathering spot within Treaty 7 territory. On the side of Sacred Buffalo Guardian Mountain, we respect the power of this place and the Stoney Nakoda Nations, the Blackfoot Confederacy, the Tsuut'ina, and the Métis, among many other peoples and nations who have come here for generations.



Banff Centre's Artist Fund

In 2019 - 2020, we were able to provide scholarships to 60% of the total artists attending programs at Banff Centre. Every artist who requested financial aid for a program with financial aid attached, received some level of scholarship. The average scholarship amount awarded represented 63% of the tuition, housing, and meals cost associated with attending an arts training program at Banff Centre.

Pivotal Experiences For Artists

During this period, 2,225 artists attended over 90 arts programs at Banff Centre. Through the generous support of our donors, Banff Centre awarded \$2.588 million in scholarships and financial assistance to 1,300 of these participants. Additionally, 108 Practicum Participants received a living allowance totaling over \$900,000. The \$1.63 million that donors gave to the Artist Fund removed financial barriers for these deserving artists to attend our programs.

We are pleased to share with you the long-term impact of Banff Centre programs, and of vital scholarship funding, from a survey in 2018:

While there have been challenges, there have also been many highlights. Here are a few from 2020 since this crisis began. Banff Centre recent milestones:

- Getting artists safely home in the early spring 2020
- Housing Banff Centre staff safely through the pandemic
- Providing over 20,000 free meals for current Banff Centre staff and for those permanently or temporarily laid off
- National Indigenous Peoples' Day – virtual celebrations (June 21, 2020)
- Midsummer Gratitude Event featuring artist alumni in online performances and videos which raised over \$870,000 (net)
- Online programs launched in Visual Arts, Literary Arts, Performing Arts, Indigenous Arts, and Indigenous and Cultural Leadership (began September 2020)
- Banff International String Quartet
 Festival (September 1-5, 2020) –
 online and free to access with over
 130,000 views
- Reopening of Walter Phillips Gallery to the public*
- Banff Centre Mountain Film and Book Festival moving online (October 31- November 8, 2020)
- Theatre revitalization project construction on the fully-funded Jenny Belzberg theatre has continued through the pandemic, and reopened in the Fall of 2020 with guided, physically distanced tours for community members and supporters*

Midsummer LIVE! is scheduled for July 24, 2021*

The Midsummer Ball has historically been a weekend to gather influential leaders, arts supporters, and philanthropists to Banff Centre's stunning campus. It is our intention to present a highly anticipated on-campus event that will continue to draw an exceptional guest list of industry, government, and community leaders. Banff Centre's top priority is to ensure the health and safety of our communities. We will continue to abide by regional, provincial, and federal government public health restrictions, especially as they relate to events, gatherings, and public performances during the COVID-19 pandemic. As public arts and cultural venues, including Banff Centre, look to reopening and scenario planning for their stability, financial constraints and appropriate staffing levels continue to be a factor with respect to providing accommodation, food, and guest services required to properly support oncampus activities.

2021 MIDSUMMER LIVE! - SNAPSHOT OF SCENARIOS

In planning for the upcoming Midsummer LIVE! event we recognize there will be uncertainty with regards to what people gathering together again will look like. This is why we see the opportunity to re-imagine a new Midsummer event as a immersive experience, with on campus and online innovations. We will continue to raise the national and international profile of Banff Centre and elevate diverse voices, including artists of colour and Indigenous artists. We will incorporate what audiences and guests love about the event into a new experience that can be delivered safely and enjoyed by our guests and partners while bolstering support for Banff Centre.

For 2021, the number of guests may be limited to around 100 people onsite. While capacity will be determined by public health guidelines, lead sponsors will have guest list priority.

For the 2021 Midsummer LIVE! event we are intending to offer the following components:

- Date of Saturday, July 24, 2021.
- Guests are welcome to stay at Banff Centre for the duration of the weekend; programming will be limited to one day.
- Onsite events held at Banff Centre, with possible increased use of outdoor spaces.
- Performance in the new Jenny Belzberg Theatre (with physicallydistanced seating).
- Artistic components throughout via spotlights, performances, interactions with artists, faculty and programming team; (performances and related events may be shorter in duration).
- We will be unable to offer brunch at the President and CEO's home. Gala dining options will be adapted. Buffet meal service on campus will be discontinued for all programs and events.

 The event will remain a vital fundraiser for Banff Centre and will include a modified auction.

Additional features may include:

- Optional lunch on arrival and check in.
- Physically-distanced campus tours.
- Live stream broadcast of show to online stakeholders and supporters.
- Boxed brunch for guests to enjoy after they check out at the end of their stay.
