The story takes place on a barge anchored in the Seine River in Paris.

Time: the present.

Michel, the owner of the barge, is standing gazing at the sunset. Georgette, his young wife, comes out of the cabin, and speaks to him. Michel suspects that she has fallen in love with someone else.

The stevedores, Tinca, Talpa and Louis, stop their work to have a glass of wine and during their short rest, a passing organ-grinder furnishes music for dancing:

Frugola, a rag-picker, comes looking for her husband Talpa, meets Georgette, and during the conversation, Georgette reveals her dissatisfaction with her life on the barge, and her wish to live in Paris.

The stevedores, having finished their work, disperse, leaving Georgette and Louis alone. They are bitter about their fate which keeps them apart, and arrange a meeting later that night. They decide upon a signal. When

Georgette thinks it will be safe for Louis to return, she will light a match. Having everything arranged, Louis departs.

When Michel returns, he pleads with Georgette. He recalls their happy days together before the death of their child, when she and the child used to nestle under his cloak, but she avoids him, and goes into the cabin. Michel is certain that she is unfaithful.

Throwing his cloak over his shoulders, he stands thinking. After a few moments he takes out his pipe, and lights a match. Louis, hiding in the shadows, sees the light, and thinking it is the signal, leaps onto the barge. Michel sees the figure. He recognizes Louis and seizes him by the throat. After forcing a confession from Louis, Michel strangles him. At this moment Michel hears his wife's voice. He wraps his cloak around the body and sits on the bench, holding the body in his arms.

Georgette appears from the cabin. She is frightened, and sorry for the lonely figure of her husband. She wants to nestle under his cloak. Michel opens the cloak and the body of her lover falls at her feet.

Because it was prohibited first production in England by the censor, The Shewing Up of Blanco Posnet (1909) has the most remarkable history of Shaw's short plays and rivals that of the best of his major plays. Shaw, ever the protagonist in the continuing battle against stage censorship, directly accused the King of keeping his play off the stage, since the Lord Chamberlain, the censor, was a member of the King's household and not a part of the government. As the battle grew hat, William Butler Yeats and Lady Gregory, outraged by such treatment of England's best playwright, took up Shaw's cause and produced "Blanco" at Dublin's Abbey Theatre in the face of the heavy apposition of the Lord Lieutenant, the English Viceroy in Ireland, who threatened to close the Abbey if the play was produced. Shaw become the

centre of a controversy that led to his appearance before a committee of Parliament appointed to examine the practice of stage censorship. "Blanco Posnet" was subsequently produced in England in 1913 when the Abbey Theatre brought its production to London.

Shaw's "sermon" of Blanco Posnet has been critically labeled one of Shaw's most religious plays as he shows God reaching out and touching men when they least expect it. Blanco's pose as a bod man is thwarted when "goodness" strikes him like lightning.

"The Shewing Up of Blanco Posnet" is presented as a Workshop Production by students in the Acting classes. Its rehearsal period was limited to two weeks, and only minimum costumes and scenery have been used.
